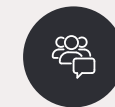

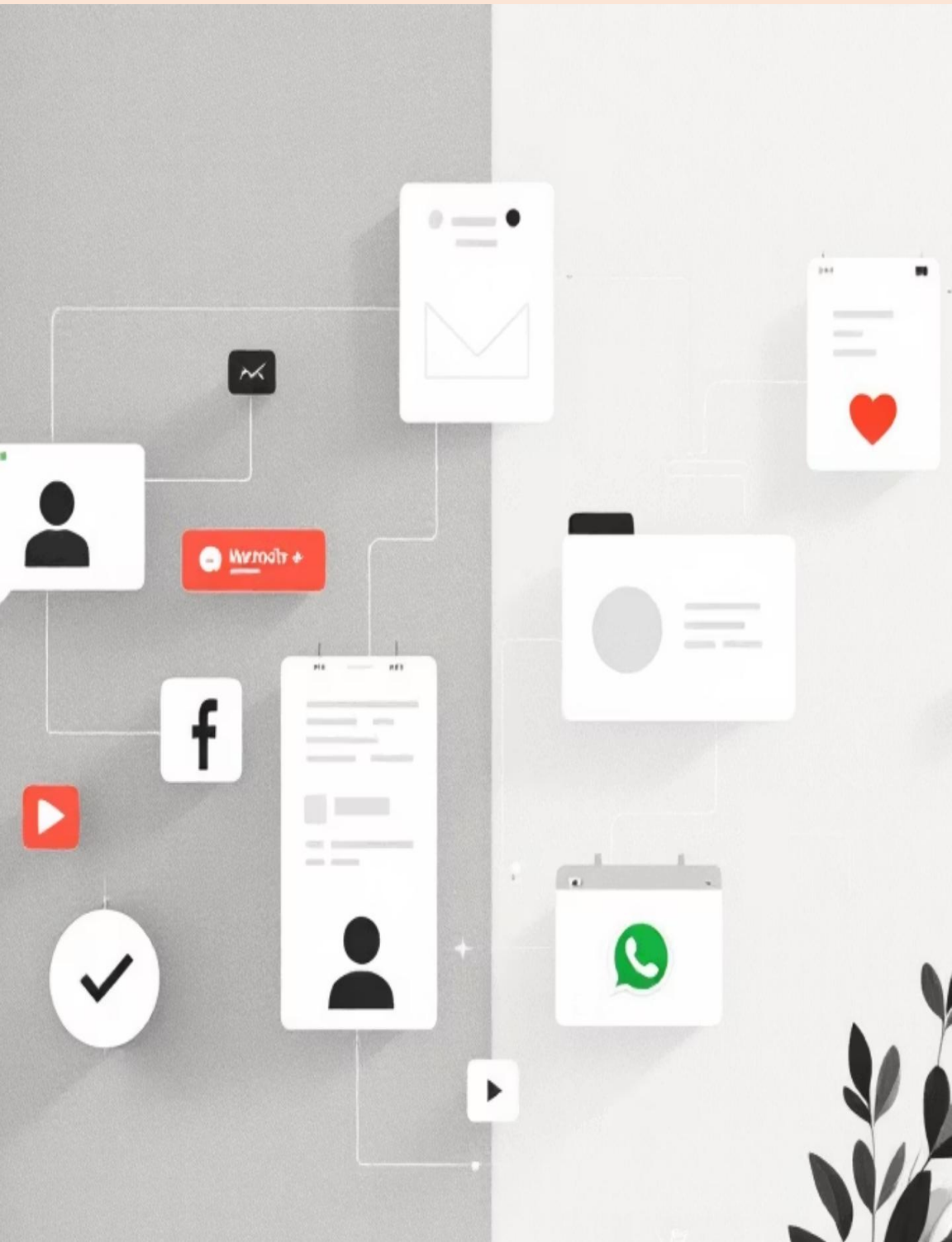


Communication & Information

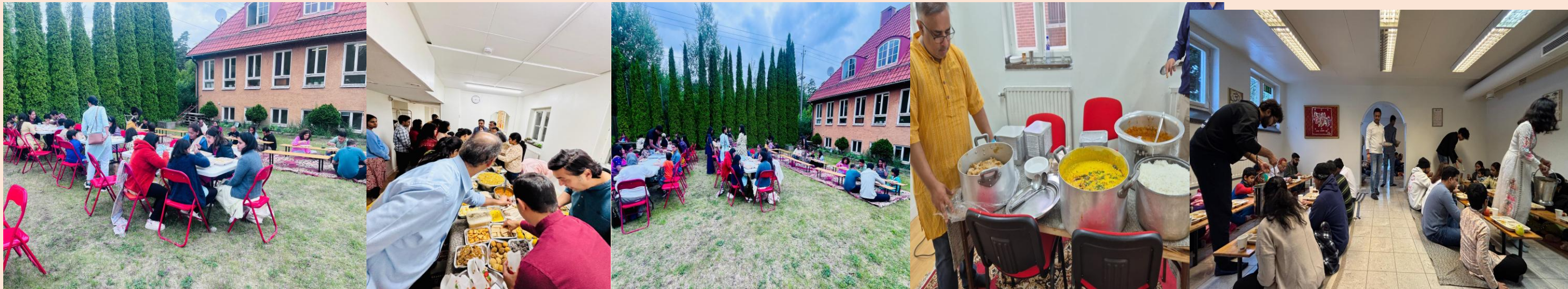

Restoring Comfort: A Mandate Accomplished

Inherited Problems, Solved in Our First Year

The First Challenge – Non working Ventilation

- Vendors proposed complete *Ventilation* system replacement costing 500,000–700,000 SEK.
- System had failed for 15 years, creating uncomfortable conditions.
- Replacement seemed like the only option.

Solution

- We paused to investigate the system's core issues.
- Discovered the problems were not terminal.
- Targeted repairs successfully restored full functionality.

- Diligently uncovered and replaced sections of long-neglected rotten wood.

Skylight Replaced, Leaks Vanquished

- Finally replaced our damaged, aging skylight to end years of persistent water leakage.

Efficient, Brighter Spaces

- Modernized our environment by replacing 50 outdated tube lights with 22 energy-efficient LEDs.

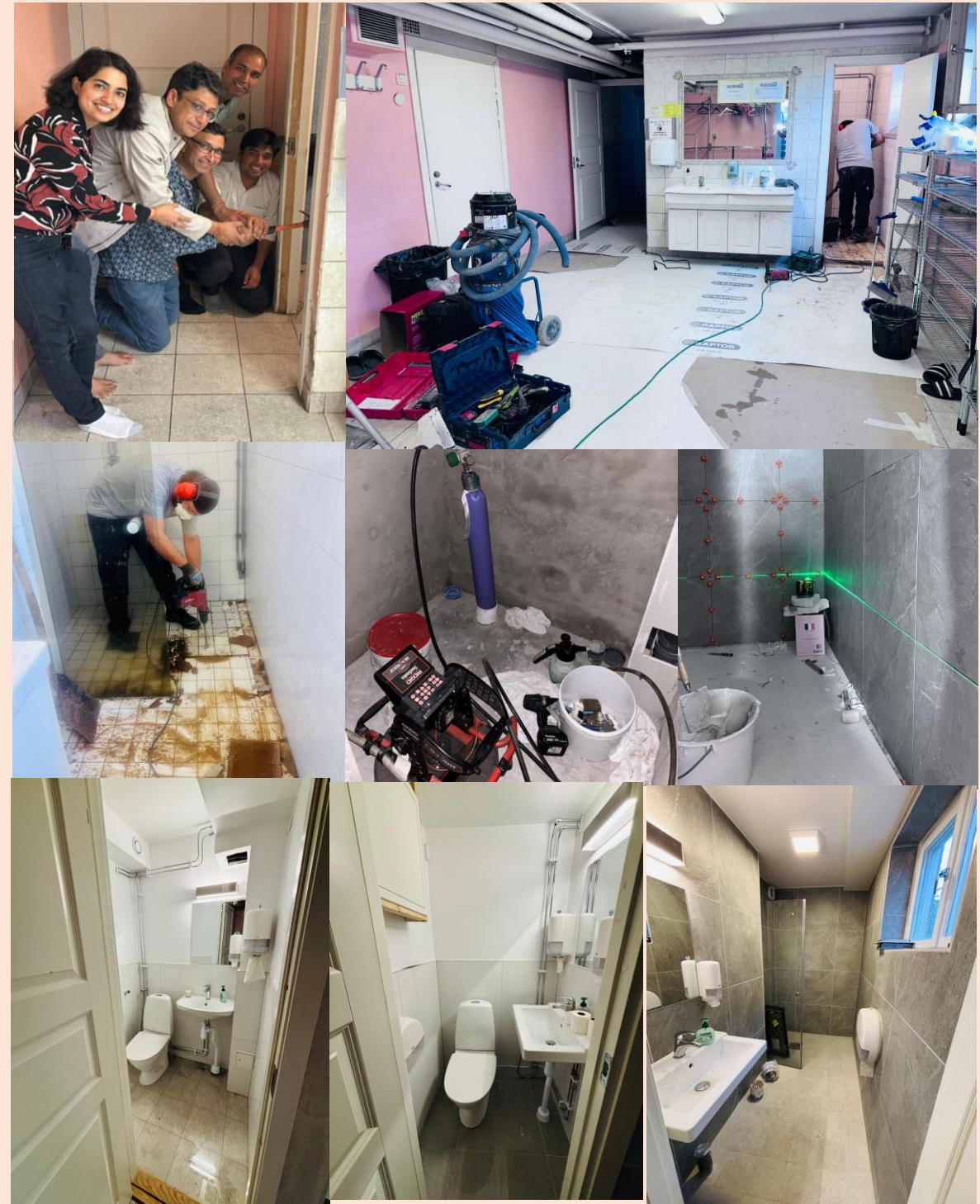

Expanding Our Vision: Future Growth

Building a Stronger, More Inclusive Community

Main Building Expansion

- *In discussion with Sollentuna to expand the existing Mandir structure*
- *Complex process, we are actively working upon*
- *Expanding our physical capacity to serve our growing community*
- *If permanent expansion isn't feasible, we're exploring temporary solutions like tents or glazed structures to expand our capacity and serve the community.*

Side Building: A Spiritual & Cultural Hub

- *Planning to establish the side building as a dedicated spiritual and cultural center for all Hindus in Sweden*
- *Vision: A dedicated spiritual and cultural center for all Hindus in Sweden to host large-scale programs and events*
- ***Indian Embassy partnership:*** *In discussions, ready to support financially once architectural plans are presented*
- *The side building will always remain under Mandir's ownership and governance*
- *All decisions regarding the side building rest with the Mandir*



Finance Overview

Expenditure Categories

Operating Expenses

Utilities (Electricity, Heating, Garbage, Water) for buildings, Internet and Phone subscription.

Pandit Ji Support

Salary/Per Diem payments, Air travel, and Visa charges for Panditji.

Administrative

External Auditor fees and software costs (Accounting, Website).

Community Services

Bhandara related expenses, food items (seasonal/frozen), and dairy products

Supplies

Disposables (plates/glasses), toiletries, cleaning materials, and cleaning services.

Festival Expenses

Sweets and festival materials including decorations, colors, and crackers.

Regulatory & Compliance Fees

Fees for Bank, Skatteverket, Bolagsverket, pest control inspections, fire safety inspections, and other regulatory compliance costs.

Revenue Sources

Monthly and yearly membership contributions.

Interest Income

Accrued interest from savings accounts.

Donations

Contributions via Swish, Bank Transfer, and cash in donation boxes.

Rental revenue generated from Lunden.



Financial Challenges, Initiatives & Achievements

Challenges Faced

- *Bank access blockage initially, caused significant delays in accounting and auditing.*
- *High operational costs as compared to income.*
- *Structural issues in main Mandir building necessitating major safety and hygiene retrofits.*

Strategic Initiatives

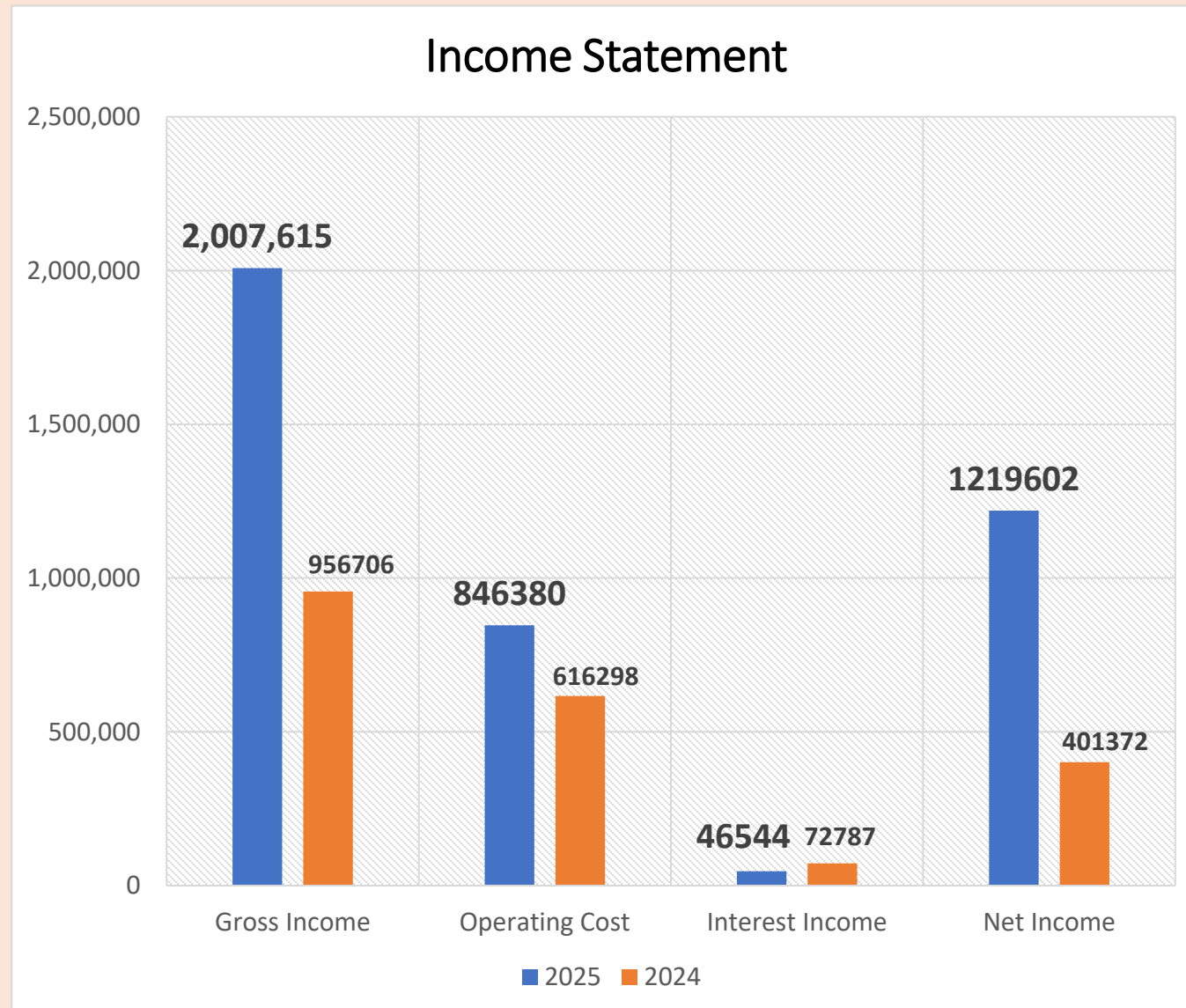
- *Diversified rental strategy for Lunden (multi-tenant approach with AYSE, Chinmaya Mission, and Swadhya).*
- *Expanded paid membership base through targeted festival and renovation drives.*
- *Successfully launched the "DonationForRenovation" campaign*
- *Transitioned from a full-time to a cost-effective rotational Panditji model.*

Year-over-Year Achievements (vs 2024)

- **Gross Income:**
Donations, Membership, and Rental income increased by 2x.
- **Net Income:**
Realized a 3x increase after paying all renovation expenses.
- **Reserves & Value:**
Cash reserves increased by ~350,000 SEK; property value up by ~800,000 SEK.
- **Cost Efficiency:**
In-kind donations saved ~200,000 SEK.
Reduced expenses related to Pandit ji, saving approx. 35000 per month.



Comparative Income Statement (All amounts in SEK)



Gross Income = Membership, Donations (cash, swish, bank transfer), Rental of Lunden

Operating Cost = Utilities, Personnel (Panditji Costs), Festival and Bhandara costs, Operational & Material Costs.

Interest Income = Interest received from Bank on Savings account.

Net Income = Gross Income (less) Operating Cost (add) interest income

Note: *Interest Income has gone down due to lower Interest Rates from Bank (SEB).*

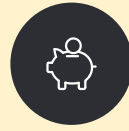

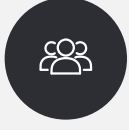

Auditor's Summary

Following a thorough review of the Hindu Mandir's financial records and operational procedures for the past fiscal year, we present the key findings from the independent audit.

Independent Audit Conclusion

*All financial accounts have been reviewed and verified, with **no material discrepancies or issues identified**. The financial statements accurately reflect the Mandir's financial position and transactions.*

Special Note on Board Discharge

*Based on the satisfactory financial oversight and governance, the previous Board of Directors is recommended for **full discharge of liability** for their stewardship during the audited period.*

This audit confirms the Hindu Mandir's commitment to financial integrity and responsible governance, ensuring transparency and trust within our community.



Challenges & Regulatory Compliance

It is with a heavy heart that we share the challenges we have faced. Despite our commitment to serving the Hindu community, we have encountered obstacles created by fellow community members who have worked against the Mandir's interests.

Environmental Department

Following a formal complaint, we proactively engaged with the department, provided a thorough explanation of our position, adhered strictly to all guidelines, and facilitated comprehensive audits. This matter is now CLOSED with a green light received.

Kronofogden Department

A complaint was filed with the Swedish Enforcement Authority. We provided a detailed response outlining our perspective, which successfully addressed their requirements. The matter is now CLOSED with a green light received.

District Court Appeal

The original complainant appealed the initial Kronofogden decision in our favor to the District Court. The court rejected their appeal. This matter is now CLOSED with a final, favorable legal resolution.

☐ *While resolving these matters required a significant investment of time, effort, and financial resources, we have emerged stronger and fully compliant.*

The successful resolution of these challenges serves as a testament to the Mandir's resilience and our unwavering commitment to maintaining the highest standards of governance and integrity for our community.

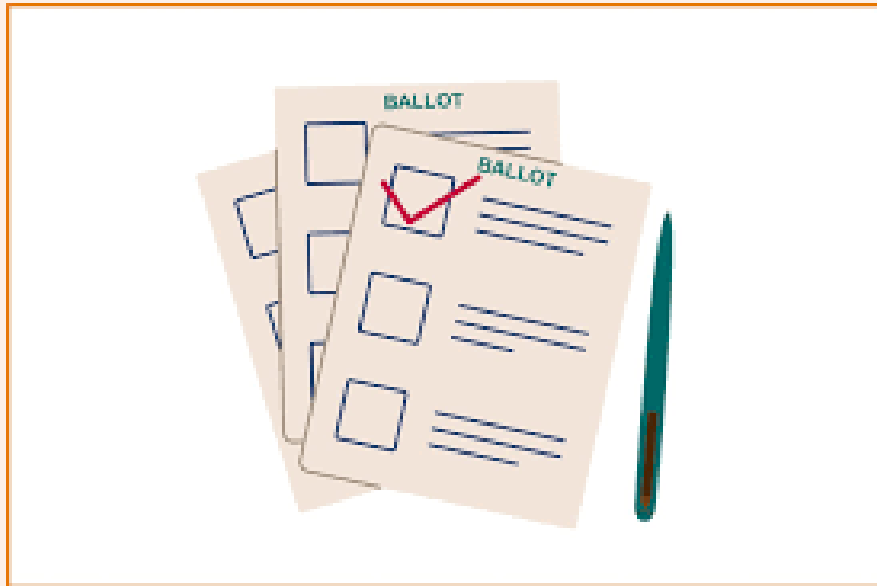

Eligibility Requirements

Voting positions: President, Vice President, Secretary of Finance, Secretary of Information, Secretary of Properties, Secretary of Festivals, and Cultural Secretary

Existing

Valid member only for 1 year

Proposed and Recommended

A member may nominate themselves only if they have maintained continuous active and valid membership for the previous three (3) consecutive years prior to nomination



Eligibility, Tenure & Term Limits

All voting position: President, Vice-President, Finance Secretary, Information Secretary, Property Secretary, Festival Secretary and Cultural Secretary

Tenure & Term Limits for a given voting position

Existing (No limit): Elected for 3 years (P, VP, FS), Elected for 1 year (IS, PS, FS, CS and **other non-voting positions**)

Proposed: Maximum 3 years for any voting positions.

Recommended: Maximum tenure for anyone voting positions is 3 year.



Eligibility, Tenure & Term Limits

All voting position: President, Vice-President, Finance Secretary, Information Secretary, Property Secretary, Festival Secretary and Cultural Secretary

Total time in the Samiti

Existing: No limit

Proposed: Maximum 5/10 year in Samiti

Proposed & Recommended: Maximum 9 years in the Samiti (including and adding tenure of all voting positions).

Exception: If no nomination received after completion of 9 year at a given position, then existing position holder may continue for 1 more year.

Bhandara Sponsorship and Membership

Existing

If someone is sponsoring for Bhandara by paying 5100 SEK, the person has to opt for membership separately.

Proposed & Recommended

If someone is sponsoring for Bhandara, the person should be considered a member. No separate membership required.

Purpose

To encourage more people to participate and sponsor Bhandara events.



E. Family Representation in Samiti

At any given point in time, **only one individual from the same family** shall be permitted to hold a position in the Samiti.

For the purpose of this provision, *family* shall include **spouse and immediate family members residing in the same household**.

This restriction shall apply to **both Voting and Non-Voting positions** in the Samiti.



③ Amendment: Clarification of Membership Categories

1. The default membership of the Mandir shall be **Family Membership (1000 SEK per year)**, which includes all immediate family members residing in the same household (spouse, children, dependent parents).
2. Individual Membership (500 SEK per year) shall be considered an exceptional category, applicable only to individuals who:
 - Live alone, and
 - Do not have family residing within the same household (e.g., students, elderly individuals living independently).
3. Any person residing with family members who opt for Individual Membership shall not be considered a valid member unless the membership category is corrected and paid. This clarification shall apply to both new and existing members.
4. There should not be any monthly membership option via Swish. If anyone wants to contribute per month, it needs to be registered via Auto-Giro or recurring BG payments.



4 Amendment: Addition of New Non-Voting Positions in Samiti

In view of expanding activities and community responsibilities, the following Non-Voting positions shall be added:

A. Bhandara Secretary (Non-Voting)

Responsible for planning and coordination of weekly Sunday Bhandara and during major festivals. Kitchen logistics and oversight

Given the frequency and scale of Bhandara activities, this role requires dedicated management.

B. Community Care Secretary (Non-Voting)

Creating structure for Hindu community care Supporting elderly members, Assisting youth and students, Coordinating community support during emergencies, Promoting inclusive engagement and welfare initiatives.

As the Mandir grows as a central Hindu institution, structured community care is essential to uphold Dharma and collective responsibility.

Purpose:

To strengthen operational efficiency and formalize community welfare responsibilities.



5] Amendment: Protection of Mandir Identity & Core Values

Any major identity-related change, including but not limited to:

- Change of the name of the Society
- Removal or permanent relocation to a distant place of any existing Bhagwan ji Vighrah

shall require approval from two consecutive year AGBM meetings following terms:

1. Approval by at least **three-fourths (3/4) majority** of members present and voting at an AGBM; and
2. Ratification by at least **three-fourths (3/4) majority** at a second consecutive AGBM.
